INFORMATION FOR PARENTS YOUR CHILD'S 2nd DOSE OF VACCINE AGAINST COVID-19

Madam, Sir,

We are now planning the second dose distribution of COVID-19 vaccine to secondary and CEGEP school students who are 12 years of age and older. It should be specified that young people must be 12 years old at the time of vaccination.

In order to take into account the fact that families will have the choice during the summer to go to the many clinics offered on the Island of Montreal, which will reduce the demand for vaccines for the start of the school year, we will not be returning IN the schools.

You will find below the different options offered **as of August 8**. Because parental consent is needed for vaccination of children that age, your presence as a parent is required during your child's vaccination and will serve as consent.

First possibility:

WITHOUT an appointment | At one of our proximity mobile clinics

We will have mobile walk-in vaccination trailers on the grounds of several schools during the month of August as well as in some public places. Watch for us in your neighbourhood on our website at: covid-nordmtl.ca.

Second possibility:

WITH an appointment | Book online Quebec.ca/vaccinCOVID

Third possibility:

WITHOUT an appointment | Bring your letter to the clinic

Time periods without an appointment will be reserved for students of schools and CEGEPs in the clinics above and indicated on our website.

We will be able to communicate information on all the services reserved for students in schools and CEGEPs in our territory at the **beginning of August**. We invite you to consult future updates on our website for details at: covid-nordmtl.ca

These vaccination clinics are reserved for students living in Montréal because each CIUSSS in Québec is responsible for vaccinating the population of its territory and receives vaccine doses accordingly. **Proof of residential address** must therefore be presented. We invite persons who do not live in Montréal to book an appointment online at a clinic in their area at [Québec.ca/vaccinCOVID](https://Quebec.ca/vaccinCOVID)

Vaccination continues throughout the summer for the entire population. If your child or family members have not yet had the opportunity to receive their 1st dose of the vaccine, be aware that vaccination is the best way to protect ourselves against COVID-19. Do not hesitate to go to one of our fixed or mobile clinics which will be present in your neighborhood throughout the summer season.

The health situation imposes tight deadlines. We are aware of this and thank you for your cooperation.
